

From the President

AS PRESIDENT OF OUR WONDERFUL CLUB, I am pleased to be able to report that the 2022 year was an extremely pleasing one when we consider lingering uncertainty post the lifting of pandemic restrictions, coupled with the second year of participation in the largest second tier competition ever entered into. Its fair to say that we were extremely competitive on the field, and we took enormous strides towards establishing a financially sustainable future for decades to come.

I remind members that the Board are merely caretakers, building for the future of WFC, and as such our standing within the AFL/VFL was enhanced in 2022, with widespread recognition that our club's facilities, hospitality, continuous improvement mantra, professional conduct, and compliance ranked in the top echelon of clubs within all national AFL competitions.

Whilst raising the VFL premiership cup aloft is the "holy grail" and the ultimate measurement of success, it is important that we are circumspect in considering that we are competing within a 21-team competition that includes 11 AFL teams, 3 AFL aligned teams, and 7 standalone teams, each of which balance winning versus development on a weekly basis.

Without fear of contradiction the positives of the year far outweighed the negatives, and whilst reflecting on the season I thought it opportune to showcase some of the highlights:

- Another year of profitability, outstanding when considering the aforementioned uncertainty that continued to effect society in many aspects of social connection
- The bolstering of our Board, with the addition of Mia Shaw, Emily Buysen and Jacqui Martin bringing their individual and collective strengths to benefit our club
- The approval and commencement of extensions to our major revenue stream the Tigers Clubhouse, with the expected completion late March 2023.
- The work undertaken on the commitment to establish Club Tarneit, a much needed additional revenue stream, with expectations of completion mid to late 2024
- Our competitiveness on the field resulted in WFC being the highest placed Victorian standalone team, narrowly missing the finals
- The continued showcasing of our venue and facilities at Avalon Airport Oval, a jewel in the crown as noted by AFL and VFL authorities in particular
- The solidarity of the players in sticking together and committing to the 2023 season virtually at the completion of the 2022 season, this indeed is testament to our values of "community, driven and care."
- The tireless work that our executives do, led magnificently by the most respected CEO in the VFL, Mark Penaluna
- The largest VFL sponsorship base and the re-signing of CB Motor Group (formerly Ballan Holden) as our major sponsor for the 24th consecutive year, a truly remarkable commitment
- The support of our loyal members and the community in the City of Wyndham, with recognition that we will field a women's VFL team when the circumstances permit
- The evolution of our team and club as witnessed at the Liston Trophy presentation. Tom Gribble winning back-to-back Liston's plus three of our players Kye Declase, Tom Gribble and Shaun Mannagh named in the VFL Team of the Year. Scott Bishop was a most deserving recipient of the Alec Gillon Medal as VFL Volunteer of the Year, in recognition of his many years of service to our club. Scott is one of many who give their time to our club and it is much appreciated and valued by everyone. Our volunteers are an important p[art of the fabric of our club.

Without highlighting individuals I must make special mention of the Board, the executive team, the players, coaches, support staff, volunteers, sponsors, members, supporters and anyone within our community that has sacrificed time, sweat, tears and financial support to ensure their club would be there for them for seasons, years, decades and centuries to come.

2022 was a year of success on many fronts, but in 2023 more than ever we need your total commitment in supporting your club both financially and in person, experiencing what our club has to offer as we strive to build the biggest sporting army our thriving community has ever seen.

It is a truly unique business and, as you can appreciate, this brings its own challenges. Wyndham Council has provided free rental a key component in the foundation of the business.

Progress is being made on Club Tarneit with a strong expectation that building will commence in March / April 2023. While nothing is ever a certainty, I do expect that in time this will be another very important strong income stream for the club.

We face the daily challenge of managing a club participating against many AFL clubs within a constantly changing VFL competition. We must continue to balance our fiscal position with providing our players and staff the best opportunities to compete, investing in our people and community as well as providing facilities that support all of the above.

I believe we are the benchmark in our commitment to our community involvement and that our facilities are superior to all clubs outside of the AFL, but that is a work in progress. We have presented an updated facility vision to various stakeholders including the AFL, Wyndham Council, State and Federal Governments with the aim of retaining this status.

We are the current custodians of the Werribee Football Club. We must continue to ask- Where do we want the club to be in five years? Are we living the club values?

I am extremely confident we are building a strong platform that is enabling our club to be a true leader in every sense. I hope you will continue to be a important part of the journey in 2023 and beyond.

From the Coach

TO reflect is important, to learn, implement and move forward is a necessity.

2022 was a season of fulfillment, we got back to enjoying and competing an uninterrupted VFL season. The interruptions of 2020 and 2021 may have caused some teething issues for our playing and coaching groups as we found our groove back into week-to-week training, preparing and performing. On the field this was reflected with sporadic patches of brilliant form, as well as downturns.

Our group was unwavering in their commitment to each other across season 2022. The enjoyment of wins was palpable, the agony of close defeats and learnings in crucial situations shared holistically. As a coach, having top echelon footballers and characters as Tom Gribble, Dom Brew, Nick Coughlan, Matt Hanson, Michael Sodomaco, Nick Hayes, Louis Pinnuck, Kye Declase and Jack Henderson continue to front up to the demands of VFL football is humbling. We look forward to this cohort acting as a strong scaffold for our playing list for season 2023.

The form fluctuations produced a season of 9 wins, 9 losses. We reflect on the positive aspects like being ranked a top 5 defensive team, statistically marrying up to the top 4 VFL sides in key performance indicators. We take solace in being winning chances deep into 15 of our 18 games. We were hard to play against.

Highlights on field come no higher than Tom Gribble being crowned the JJ Liston medallist. After winning the gong in 2019, Tom has only progressed his football and influence, both on and off the playing field. The exciting aspect of Tom's football is that he is as driven as ever to achieve team success, naturally progressing his own output in the process.

From a team perspective we got to work across the middle parts of the year. Shaping our season from a 2-4 win/loss start, to an 8-5 win/loss mid-season record. The proudest element of this stretch of form was the significant influence our leadership group had in fronting up to the challenge, assisting with subtle shifts in game style and executing on game day. Amid this we really did unearth what type of character our players have. A trip to Punt Road on an unusual Wednesday night fixture after our players had dusted off their work boots and put away the computers of a regular

workday to beat a substantial Richmond VFL side. This acts as an ongoing source of trust of where our group can get to with their significant mental aptitude to play the hand that is dealt.

A lean stretch in the back end of the season, culminating in three losses by under 12 points summed up our 2022. We were close, we were competitive, but ultimately, we couldn't sustain for long enough against quality oppositions.

Looking forward a large quantity of the club's future players are now progressing from VFL youngsters to hardened VFL players. Jay Dahlhaus, Lucas Rocci, Hudson Garoni, Jesse Clark and others have now experienced sustained VFL football and what is required. The challenge is to continue to develop their bodies and form to excel at the level. Our performances of season 2022 only act as a baseline for what's to come.

Mark Micallef our Football Manager has done a tremendous job in keeping our list together. As well as adding some targeted recruiting pieces around the edges to bolster our squad's depth of talent.

I was able to celebrate the season at our end of season function, which saw tremendous performances acknowledged. Tom Gribble a two-time Liston Medallist became a two-time Bruce Montgomery Trophy winner. Kye Declase was a brilliant runner-up, Shaun Mannagh and Louis Pinnuck capped great seasons to round out the top 4.

I'd like to thank the tireless work of my assistant coaches across season 2022 to give the players their best chances to perform. Nick Daffy has stayed on as a senior assistant coach for the upcoming season. Tom Perrett and James Saker have moved on from their respective posts for the football club but will always be recognised as strong contributors to this aspiring group of players. Any successes in the future will be somewhat attached to the hard work of so many around the Werribee Football Club that sacrifice an awful lot to progress our club.

The High-Performance department of our club must be commended. The availability of players throughout the season was the envy of the competition. Their commitment to task and compliance gave our players their best chance to perform at the VFL level. To Scott Graham (HP Manager), James Davis (Head Physio) and Rebecca Beaton (Club Doctor), we thank them for their unwavering efforts for the Werribee Football Club. All three have moved on from their posts, progressing in their careers, much to our delight as a football program.

Thanks for taking some time to reflect on 2022 with me, but more importantly commit to a strong 2023 as that is what lies ahead for us as our next moment.

Werribee CEO Mark Penaluna first met Ashley in 2004 and said he will be remembered fondly for his dedication and willingness to support the club anyway he could.

"Ashley was asked to volunteer in managing our 40th year celebrations and tiding up our Past Players and Officials database which should have only lasted three months. After 17 years and 3 months Ashley leaves us but no doubt his spirit, generosity, humour and club orientation will be with us forever.

"Nothing was ever a problem for Ashley, whether it was being at Avalon Airport Oval by 7am for all the home games, applying covers to the centre of the ground, setting up functions, property management and much more.


"Characters like Ashley are rare, even scarcer given the voluntary contribution he provided. Ashley leaves behind a wonderful legacy at the Werribee Football Club and of course his children Amanda, Melissa, Sue and Craig who he absolutely adored."

Ashley was also a proud player sponsor for many years and sponsored current Werribee coach Michael Barlow who said he will remember Ashley's generous nature and sense of humour.

"When I first arrived at Werribee in 2008 Ash player sponsored me without hesitation. At the time you take that somewhat for granted. A volunteer spending countless hours supporting the club and then spending their hard earned on a new player to the club," he said

"I think he wanted to sponsor a player he could take the mickey out of. He certainly did that, but always did it in good humour and would take as good as he gave. On return in 2019 he spent up again to sponsor me and continued to take the mickey out of me at the same time.

"I still have 15 pairs of Werribee shorts from 2019 as I continually "forgot" to bring my allocated pair to games. Ash would never let me run out in my jocks unfortunately, but on a few occasions it was threatened. A special person to our club."



As a club we have been saddened by the death of former player John Lloyd who passed away earlier this month after a long illness. He was 77.

John played 29 matches for Carlton before joining Werribee ahead of the 1970 season. He was the 93rd player to represent Werribee and played 26 games in his two seasons while winning the club's best and fairest in 1971.

The club will wear black armbands in John's memory during this weekend's home match against Geelong. Our thoughts go out to all members of the Lloyd family. RIP.

Tom Gribble wins second J.J Liston Trophy

WERRIBEE co-captain Tom Gribble is now a two-time J.J Liston Trophy winner after a stunning victory in this year's VFL best-and-fairest.

Gribble became the first Werribee player to win the league's top honour twice and just the fourth player to win the award back-to-back having topped the last Liston Trophy count in 2019.

The 27-year-old polled 30 votes to finish eight ahead of Southport Sharks teammates Jacob Dawson and Boyd Woodcock. He received votes in 12 matches, which included eight best-on-ground performances.

Gribble averaged a career-high 33.2 disposals per game in 2022 and led the VFL in total disposals with 597. He also ranked first for inside 50s (100) and was second for clearances (132) and contested possessions (249).

Gribble said it was incredible to win the award for a second time after drawing motivation from a challenging year off in 2020 and several other factors.

"It's sort of hard to put into words really, I thought 2019 was a bit mind numbing but this is equal to that...it's a great honour," he said.

"I think the harbouring of the ambition to go on and play AFL footy has held me in good stead to find continual improvement within my game and I was also a little disappointed with how I played last year.

"Coming off the year off and my dad passing I didn't play as well as I would have liked even though it was only a nine-game season.

"That spurred me on to get cracking a little bit earlier in terms of starting preseason, so the whips were cracking for me in August and then the captaincy also added another layer.

"I probably put more pressure on myself to perform and I did have a few conversations with Mick (Barlow) throughout the middle part of the year, in particular to just release and not put so much pressure on myself."

Prior to being crowned the league's best-and-fairest Gribble was named in the centre in the Team of the Year and was joined by Werribee teammates Kye Declase (wing) and Shaun Mannagh (half-forward).

Declase averaged 22.3 disposals per game this year and tallied the second most marks in the competition (137) while adding 21 goals for the campaign.

Mannagh was Werribee's second leading goal kicker this season with 27 majors and topped the league with 30 goal assists to go with 19.6 disposals per game.

Werribee timekeeper Scott Bishop was also recognised on the night receiving the Alex Gillon Award as the VFL Volunteer of the Year.

The long-time servant has filled the role as Werribee's timekeeper at both home and away matches for the past 23 years, overseeing more than 650 games in that time.

Community Report

IN 2022 the community and engagement team attended more than 80 clinics across eight schools in Wyndham. This resulted in 319 new local Auskickers and 153 new junior members. Overall, we had 1280 participants take part in our Werribee In Schools Program.

The Unity Cup is a great initiative by the AFL to target the underrepresented communities and one we have been actively involved in for a number of years. We fielded teams thanks to a collaboration with the North Melbourne Football Club. We were able to have two teams of boys and girls participate on the day with both teams just missing out on the grand final. As well as the benefits for those who took part it also strengthens our relationship with North Melbourne.

The Annual CDC Champions Day was also another huge success in 2022, senior coach Michael Barlow and members of our playing list were in attendance assisting with the on field activities and sharing with the participants their own journeys in football and life.

A significant event was hosting our inaugural Indigenous round which included wearing a specially designed jumper to represent the first nations people linked to the land, culture and people of Werribee. This event was carefully crafted and planned to acknowledge its historic importance. As well as a pre-match day ceremony, our players and staff were part of a traditional smoking ceremony at training leading up to the round. These experiences was extremely beneficial.

Healthy Living Round was another highlight of 2022, the days many activities included a number of local community businesses having stalls at Avalon Airport Oval promoting various different healthy living alternatives. Free fruit was available for everyone throughout the day in keeping with the theme. Invicta Performance also ran a halftime sprint for the crowd to participate in.



Our Involvement with Wyndham Community & Education Centre stepped up another level. We conducted two personal development workshops run in conjunction with the North Melbourne Huddle to provide extra support around careers for the students. A Welcome to AFL session teaching the fundamentals of the game was very popular.

The year ended on a very positive note with the reaction to our Multicultural Academy. More than 40 participants attended the sessions with a very strong engagement from both participants and parents. Werribee players Ariek Lual and Shaun Manaugh were both great in helping the kids learn and develop their craft. This Academy will act as a blueprint for the Next Generation Academy.

As you can see there is no shortage of willing participants and programs and our club is leading the way in providing much needed pathways for community members to be involved in our game, both on and off the field. We thank CDC & Pacific Werribee for their continued support of the Werribee Football Club's initiatives

We look forward to what 2023 will bring us and can't wait to have the Werribee faithful cheering at Avalon Airport Oval!
